
FCHUM Christmas Holiday Cheer Program

In recent years, we have helped at Thanksgiving with Fern Creek United Ministries' (FCHUM's) Thanksgiving Holiday Cheer program. However, this year St. Stephen has been collecting toys, filled shoeboxes, and toiletries for other programs, so we are going to participate in FCHUM's *Christmas* Holiday Cheer program instead. We hope to make **at least 8 Holiday Cheer Christmas baskets** for needy families in our community. Holiday Cheer baskets contain everything a family needs to prepare their Christmas dinner. These baskets will be distributed by the Fern Creek/Highview United Ministries just before Christmas. Look for a display in the narthex that will aid you in buying food items for this project. We need to collect the food items no later than **Sunday**, **December 11th**.

For each basket we will need:

- stuffing mix
- 1-5 lb. pound of potatoes (bring close to FCHUM delivery date)
- 1-3 lb. bag of onions (bring close to FCHUM delivery date)
- 2-cans of cranberry sauce
- 3 to 5 cans of green vegetables (green beans, peas...)
- 3 to 5 cans of mixed vegetables (corn, yams...)
- 1 to 2 cans of pie filling
- 1 bag of flour and 1 bag of sugar
- \$15-\$25 gift certificate to buy meat/perishable items




2017 Offering Envelope Boxes Available

COMFORT IN PRAYER

fter a long exhausting day training with a group of U.S. Marine Corps Reserve membera, Cris Frigm, pastor of Trinity Lutheran in Taneytown, Md, and a US. Nav y Reserve chaplain, handed out prayer books and led night prayer in the field. Following worship, members turned in for the night leaving not one prayer book behind.

"Every time I train with the group, I try to lead a service out of the prayer book," said Frigm. "Sometimes they take the books with them, and sometimes they don't. This particular night, it seemed they really needed the time for worship. Not one book came back to me."

Now in his sixth y ear as a Navy Reserve chaplain, Frigm has developed a long relationship with a group of residents at Oakwood Lutheran Ministries in Wisconsin who, inspired by the Green Bay Packers, call themselves the Oakwood Packers, During the third Friday of each month, they pack baxes of prayer books and ship them to pastors like Frigm.

"My first deploy ment was to Camp Lemonnier in Djibouti, Africa. That was the first time I received the books," he said. "They have been a great resource especially with the Marine Reservists because they don't get a lot of support outside their drill weekend. It's helpful for them to take that book with them and have that extra support."

Ron Mach, a retired pastor and Oakwood resident of 14 years, said he has spent the past nine of those years volunteering with the packing group. "This opportunity for serving our sons and daughters in the military with food for the spirit as well as food for the body was the right mission for our Oakwood Packers," said Mach. "We have a joyful sense of partnership with the ministry of Chaplain Frigm who provides pastoral care in the name of Christ and the ELCA."

To date, the group has packed approximately 1,000 boxes to send to various ministries throughout the world, and they hope to continue their ministry long into the future.
