We colored. We crafted and we filled in worksheets about our Bible lessons to take home with us.

We also loved to sing! We may not have been very skilled - but wow were we loud. We took very seriously the psalmist's call to make a joyful noise unto the Lord! I learned to sing "Jesus Loves Me" - "Hear the Pennies Dropping" - "If I were a Butterfly" - "Jesus Loves the Little Children" - "Zacchaeus" and so many more truly wonderful songs.

And there were Birthday Crowns! Every year on the Sunday closest to your birthday you could choose and wear a beautiful construction paper and glitter crown. Your crown made you feel so very special. And then everyone in the ENTIRE church knew it was your birthday and they would wish you a Happy Birthday over and over again!

I learned so much from attending Sunday school each week at Trinity Lutheran Church.

Yes - I learned Bible stories. I learned those foundations of the Christian faith that every Christian should know like the 10 Commandments - the story of the Good Samaritan and the feeding of the 5,000. I learned about Noah and Jonah and Ruth and Gideon too. I met Paul and Peter and Lydia and all of the Marys (there are quite a few).

And I also got to ask some really big questions about faith. I learned there was room for me and my big questions in the church. (Thankfully there still is room for me and my big questions in the church - because I am absolutely full of big questions!)

I am so thankful for those early years of Sunday school. I am so thankful for the Christians who taught me and gave so generously of their time and talents. I am so grateful for the opportunities I had to learn and grow as a Christian.

Sunday school is still an important part of my life. I love Sunday school and look forward to it all week. love studying the Bible with my sisters and brothers in Christ. I love the discussions we have and the questions that come up. Sunday school really and truly is a lot of fun!

- We have resumed singing hymns and hope to be singing the full liturgy by sometime later this fall. (This is another good reason for wearing your masks.)

Please be patient with us as we try make things as normal as possible while we also keep everyone safe.




Celebrate Rally Day!



Next Social Ministries Collection


