I wanted to take this opportunity and thank everyone for all the generous gifts this holiday season of food, toiletries, gifts, new toys, baby items, time and many other donations. The regular meeting of the council was called to order by council president Brenda Firquin. Prayer was offered by Pr. McFarland. Members present: B. Firquin, C. Markley, C. Miller, A. Goebel, B. Zimmerman, D. Steines, M. Sarson, Pr. McFarland, R. Firquin (recording secretary). Members absent: L. Faue, K. Markley, P. Kiser. A guorum was established.

Secretary's Report: R. Firquin

The minutes of the November meeting were printed in the December newsletter. M/S- A. Goebel/C. Markley to accept the minutes as printed. Carried.

Pastor's Report: Pr. McFarland

- 1. The Christmas Eve services are planned for 5:00 and 11:00 p.m. Both will be candle light services.
- 2. Plans for Lent are moving forward. Lent will begin with Ash Wednesday on February 10, 2016. Easter is March 27, 2016. Prayer vigils are planned for the Wednesday services. Watch for more information in the coming weeks.

President's Report: B. Firquin

1. Through November, the average weekend attendance was 112. Reported attendance for the morning service on 12/13/15 was 120 in support of the annual children's Christmas play.

Financial Reports: B. Zimmerman

M/S accept the Treasurer's report, (printed at the end of the minutes). D. Steines/C. Markley. Carried.

Old Business:

The financial committee presented the proposed 2016 budget for council discussion. This is the second presentation to the
council. Individual line items were discussed and questions answered by committee members present. The final budget proposal
will be presented to the council at the January meeting. At that time the council can approve or send budget back to committee.
The approved proposed budget will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting in February.

New Business:

- 1. Discussion of the new Advent banners: HOPE, JOY, LOVE, and PEACE. M/S C. Miller/B. Zimmerman to pay for banners from the memorial account. Carried.
- 2. Committee chairpersons are reminded to provide annual reports to C. Markley ASAP for inclusion in the annual meeting packet.
- 3. The council discussed the job descriptions and work week for the church secretary and custodian. The job descriptions and related responsibilities are being defined as well as a process for annual reviews by council president, Pr. McFarland, and council members. The council believes these job descriptions and reviews are necessary to keep our church running in good order as well as to address any current or future issues or hiring necessities. The council approved the weekly hourly guidelines for the custodian at 20 hours and the secretary at 15 hours. M/S-B. Zimmerman/M. Sarson.
- 4. The council discussed the current cleaning fee for use of the building space by members as well issues at past meetings. After much discussion, a motion and second (C. Miller/D. Steines) was made to eliminate the fees for building usage for congregation members and to charge non-members the current usage fees, which would be paid directly to the church not the custodian. Carried.

Church Committee Reports:

Finance: C. Markley - see reports at the end of the meeting minutes

1. B. Zimmerman reported as a follow up to the presentation by P. Markley to the congregation, the 2015 budget, giving compared to expenses, is in very good shape as we close out the fiscal year. It looks like giving will be more than was budgeted, meaning we will close the year with a good ending balance in all church accounts. Many council members, who have served on previous councils, cannot recall a more successful year in congregational giving compared to spending. While many items in the budget are below the budgeted amount, it is comforting to the finance committee and council that members responded to the financial concerns in the first quarter of 2015. It was noted the normal summer drop off in giving was not as drastic as in the past. It was noted though, that mortgage fund giving has decreased. Currently, there is a 3 month cushion in that account. It does not look like an approved proposal to make a direct principle payment from this account will be possible. But, the property annex account

is currently over the required balance, so some amount will be transferred to make a principle payment to the mortgage. Overall, it has been a very successful financial year for the church. Council members wish to thank all congregation members for their response to God's will and call to support His work through the church.

Evangelism: R. Sarson

Michelle Sarson reported that Rita will be resigning as the chair of this committee. She will remain involved, but wishes to hand
over the responsibility to another member. If anyone is interested, please contact Rita or Pr. McFarland. The council wishes to
thank Rita for her committed and devoted service, many times acting as the only member active in the committee work, throughout the years.

Fellowship: C. Miller

 Deb Steines reported that more than \$260.00 was raised through the sale of the handmade Christmas ornaments. The proceeds will support the sewing group's work for supplies to continue the "T-Shirt Dress" outreach mission.

Worship and Music: B. Firquin

 Decorating for Christmas will be on Sunday, December 20 following the 10:00 am service. Poinsettia delivery will be December 18.

Property and Grounds: R. Firquin

1. So far, the weather has co-operated, but soon the snow will fall. The tractor snow blade will be installed as the calendar flips to January. Hopefully, we will not have a lot of snow to move around this winter.

Christian Education: A. Goebel

1. VBS planning will begin next month. The Sunday night through Thursday night schedule will continue. It seemed to work very well last year. VBS will be July 10th – July 14th in 2016.

Social Ministry: R. Firquin/Pr. McFarland

 The final quarter FCHUM/social ministry collection will take place in December. Through the 3rd quarter, \$777.00 has been donated to FCHUM through the special collections.
