- 62% of JCPS students receive reduced price breakfast and/or lunch (0 to 40¢) every school day?

In addition, those in elementary school receive a “backpack” every Friday afternoon with nutritious food for the weekend, but that is only DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR. In the summer those children must rely on other sources like the Food Pantry at Fern Creek-Highview United Ministries. Unfortunately the Food Pantry inventory is at the lowest during the summer. During those times the amount of food a family receives is much less than during the rest of the year. This summer we want to make sure every child served by the FCHUM Food Pantry has as much food as possible.

You are invited to join our VBS families in sharing God’s incredible love with the world. **Our VBS service project this year is to collect foods like canned pasta, macaroni and cheese, canned meat, and soup for the Fern Creek/Highview United Ministries during the month of July.**

The need for these items is great. So let’s see what we can do. Let’s see how many cans and boxes we can gather and see how many folks we can help feed.

## St. Stephen Lutheran Church, Congregational Council Meeting

June 17, 2015

The meeting of the congregation council was called to order on Wednesday, June 17, 2015. This meeting was necessary due to lack of a council quorum for the regularly scheduled meeting.

A quorum was established. Members present: Brenda Firquin, Cheryl Markley, Connie Miller, Andrea Goebel, Larry Faue, Buddy Zimmerman, Michelle Sarson, Rod Firquin (recording secretary). Members absent: Duane Steines, Kenna Markley, Paul Kiser, Pastor K. McFarland

The meeting was called to order and prayer was offered by council president B. Firquin.

**Secretary's Report: R. Firquin**

The minutes of the May meeting were printed in the June newsletter. No changes were made. M/S- B. Zimmerman/A. Goebel to accept minutes as printed in the June newsletter. Carried.

**President's Report: B. Firquin**

The average weekend attendance for the previous 5 weeks is reported at 75.

**Pastor's Report: Pr. McFarland** (reported by B. Firquin)

1. New members will be welcomed on June 28. Teta Thompson will be welcomed as a new member and by baptism, Stephen Goma and Rebecca Grace Kahn. We welcome these newest members to our congregation.
2. Pr. McFarland will be on vacation July 17-25.
3. St. Stephen continues to have wide ranging discussions with the congregations of St. Alban and Messiah/Trinity. The discussions are lively and touch on many issues facing those congregations. The next meeting will be held on June 24 at St. Stephen beginning at 7:00 p.m. All are welcomed.

**Financial Reports: B. Zimmerman**

The May 2015 Treasurer's Report was presented to the council. The finance committee did not meet in May but will meet in June. M/S-L. Faue/C. Miller to accept the report as presented. Carried.

**Old Business:**

1. The congregation will be updated on the financial status of the church through the first half of the current year on July 12. A member of the financial committee will present information to the congregation at the close of the morning worship service. The congregation is invited to stay after the information session for coffee and fellowship sponsored by the council. Members will be available for questions/suggestions.
2. Building and grounds chair, Rod Firquin, will contact HVAC provider to check the AC for the courtyard room.

**New Business:**

1. A \$5,000.00 donation was made by a member to be paid directly to the principle of the mortgage and to purchase new round tables for the fellowship hall. The tables (6) will be purchased from Sam's Club at a cost of \$99.00 each(\$594.00) leaving the remaining amount, \$4,406.00, to be paid directly to the principle. The council wishes to thank the anonymous donor for their generous gift. No motion or council action needed since this was a designated donation.
2. Council discussed the timeline for payment to the principle. The finance chair informed the council the payment would lower the amount of interest deducted from each payment, thus increasing the monthly amount paid toward the principle each month. M/S-B. Zimmerman/C. Markley to make the payment to the principle as soon as possible to begin the savings noted. Carried.
3. The council discussed how the old round tables will be dispensed with when the new tables are purchased. A recommendation was made to ask G. Eisenbrey if some could be used in the confirmation classroom, to ask Sunday School teachers if any are needed in any classroom, and to ask FCHUM if any are needed at the center before the tables are disposed of.
4. A council member brought a concern voiced by a congregation member about the number of inserts in the weekly bulletin. The concern was the cost of the inserts and how confusing the inserts sometimes were. After discussion, the council believes the information given in all forms to the congregation is important. The council believes members should have various ways to get important information; newsletters, e-mails, text messages, website, announcements at worship, prayer chains, and bulletin inserts. It was noted at this time, half way through the year, the office budget is within expectations. If members have specific suggestions about what should be eliminated from the inserts on a weekly basis, please communicate those suggestions to Pr. McFarland or council president, Brenda Firquin.

1. Supplies for the "Blessing Bags" will be collected in the near future for distribution in July, August, and September. Watch for information on this effort to support the neediest in the community.
2. The SYNOD's outreach program "God's work, our Hands" will be kicked off in September. We are looking to the congregation for suggestions on we can participate as a congregation in this community outreach effort. Contact Michelle Sarson or Rita Sarson with ideas.

**Fellowship: C. Miller**

1. The committee will help in preparation, distribution, and clean-up of the meals for VBS. Volunteers are needed to supply the meals for the five nights of VBS. A sign-up is in the narthex.

**Worship and Music: B. Firquin**

1. A joint music event with the choirs of St. Stephen, St. Alban, and Messiah/Trinity has been delayed until a later date.
2. A new altar cloth has been made and donated by Suzanne Hansen. It is a beautiful addition to the sanctuary. Many thanks to Suzanne for her donation and her handiwork.
3. The committee has had an ongoing discussion of the printed directions for reception of communion by worship attendees. At this time the committee does not recommend any changes until new worship booklets are printed due to cost associated with the change. There also is some disagreement with the "official" ELCA stance on who should be invited to receive communion at services. If you have strong feelings on this issue, please discuss with Pr. McFarland or a worship/music committee member.
4. The church website has been updated. Please take a look at it, and if you have suggestions, contact Brenda Firquin.
5. The 500 year anniversary of the Reformation will be during 2017. The committee will be discussing how St. Stephen can recognize this important event in the Lutheran faith.
6. The upcoming "Kentucky Tasting" event, July 25 from 7:00-9:00 p.m., was discussed. It will be a fundraising event with proceeds split with FCHUM. The cost will be \$10.00 per person. Kentucky foods, spirits, and fun will be on the menu for the evening. Hank Evans and his band of talented musicians will provide the music. Look for information in coming weeks and mark this evening on your "must do" calendar.

**Property and Grounds: R. Firquin**

1. The wheels on the tractor mowing deck have been replaced.
2. The large bushes in front of the old narthex and the rental house have been removed. The new landscaping cost was donated by a member and the new plants have been planted. Mulching will take place soon after some weeds have been killed in the beds. Many thanks to Jack McFarland for his assistance in planting the flower beds.
3. The push mowers, which were donated, are not in the best of working shape. Both the self-propelled mowers are either not running properly or the self-propelled drive on one is not working. M/S- Zimmerman/Goebel to use the remaining amount of the landscaping donation, if the donor approves, and any additional amount from maintained budget to purchase a new self-propelled mower. The Property & Grounds chair should purchase as soon as possible. Carried.
4. It was brought to the attention of the P/G chair that the house next to the rental property has been sold to a "technology business". The building is currently being gutted and remodeled to work for this company. It is good to have the property occupied again as this adds to the security of the entire area. At this time, the P/G chair sees no negative impact on the church or the property we own.

**Christian Education: A. Goebel**

1. VBS is will be July 5-9 and all is going well in the planning of the week. Volunteers for evening dinners are needed. If you wish to volunteer as a leader or assistant for one of the groups, see A. Goebel. We look forward to a wonderful week.

**Social Ministry: R. Firquin/Pr. McFarland**

1. The annual Red Cross Blood drive sponsored by St. Stephen will be Tuesday, June 23 from 3:00 to 7:00p.m. Please encourage fellow workers and family members to give the life giving gift of blood.

The council will not meet in July. The next meeting will be August 9 following the 10:00 a.m. service.

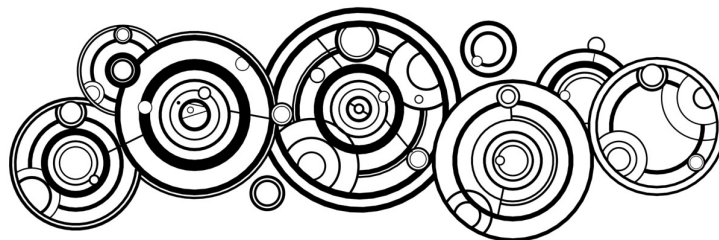
