## From Pastor Laura: News & Hope From Synod Assembly

Rod and Brenda Firquin and I just returned from our Indiana-Kentucky Synod Assembly where we gathered under the theme: "God's Work, Our Hands: Extraordinary Grace through Ordinary People." It was a time of discernment, as we prayerfully called a new bishop (Rev. Bill Gafkjen...pronounced, "Guff-ee-uhn"), and renewal, as we studied and prayed and worshiped together. I always wish that more people could experience the church in assembly because we grow so much from the interactions with other Lutherans and from being a part of the larger church in mission. But I especially wish to share with you the sense of hope that we experienced this year.

For at least the past decade, the ELCA has been torn by division. We are still grieving over the loss of congregations that have left us, and those who are in the process of leaving. Like most mainline churches, we are suffering a decline in membership. The impact of those losses, plus the economic depression, has left the church with substantially fewer resources with which to do mission. Bishop Stuck, in his sermon offered for congregations to use Assembly weekend, suggests that the church many of us grew up in is dying. Not because of actions taken by churchwide last year, but because our culture has become so secular. Sports, school activities, family commitments, travel, entertainment...so many other things take precedence over the church now. So where is the hope?

Bishop Stuck pointed to Sunday's gospel lesson, the story of Jesus raising from death the son of a widow in Nain (Luke 7:11-17), as a message of hope for our church. Jesus interrupts the funeral procession, tells the widow not to weep, and then proceeds to tell the dead son to rise. "With that same compassion Jesus sees the death march we are on as a church. He sees our grief and knows our pain. He grieves with us over the loss of the church. He had prayed that we might be one for the sake of his mission in the world. His father's desire was that all might come to him through the death and resurrection of the son, Jesus. So, it must grieve him to see our pews half empty and our classrooms closed on Sunday morning. His heart must ache to see families at ball games on Sunday morning rather than worshipping and learning with the people of God. It must frustrate him to see his church paralyzed by controversy and disagreement and unable to fully do the mission of God in the world.

"However, as Jesus says to the widow so he says to us, 'Do not weep.' He says this to the widow because he was about to do a great miracle. He says this to us because he is about to do something quite miraculous with his church. By the power of the Spirit, he is stopping the death march we are on and giving us new life.

"That's exactly what God, the Father, did in sending his Son into the world. He stopped the death march we were on as the world....because of this intervention by God, we are a people who no longer weep. We know that God is up to something. This is God's church and God is doing something great to renew and transform the church. God is working on us to prepare us for the future mission we are called to do. What this mission will look like, we don't yet know. What the church will be in the future is yet to be revealed. But what we do know is that it will not be the same.



"Yes, we will never have our old church back. Many of our dreams for the church have vanished. They probably needed to vanish, because they were our dreams and not God's. We are being called back into prayer, study of scripture and discernment in order to allow God to lead us into this new future. By the power of the Spirit, we are being called to let go of the church and place it in God's hands."

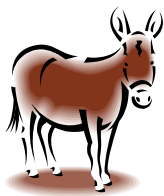

A Forum with the Rev. Rudy Mueller

On Sunday, May 23, our congregation was blessed to have Rev. Rudy Mueller, assistant to Bishop Stuck, preach at our services and lead us in a wonderful, spiritual workshop. The workshop helped us refocus our attention on the true mission of St. Stephen Lutheran Church and reflect on how each of us participates, influences, and possibly detracts from that mission.

During our interim and search period, our congregation has changed dramatically from what it was. We have learned more about ourselves and the challenging task of operating a church. We have also become more independent, more resilient, and maybe more divided. With Rev. Mueller's guidance, we looked outside ourselves and remembered what St. Stephen's existence and what our future are all about. Through Bible study, games, and group reflection, we bonded and perhaps opened ourselves for God's Holy Spirit to help us discern some elements of our Christ-inspired charge. Some of these elements include:

A quorum was established and the regular meeting of the congregation council was called to order. Council President David Wigginton offered prayer for the council's work.

**Secretary's Report: Rod Firquin**

The minutes from the May meeting were printed in the June newsletter. All members indicated they had read the minutes. M/S (P. Kiser./J. Morani) to accept the minutes as printed in June newsletter. Carried.

**Pastor's Report: Pastor Meier**

1. The church has been contacted by Life Line Screening Program for use of the church. This organization provides, at a cost, screening for various illnesses and cardio vascular diseases. After discussion, Paul Kiser, will contact and investigate this company and program before the council makes a commitment to allow use of the building.
2. Liz Swasko has invited the church to participate in an energy saving audit assessment. The company Liz works for does this for business applications and wants to branch out into the non-profit area. The audit/assessment would provide suggestions for energy savings for the church. There will be no cost to the church for this service. M/S (J. Morani/T. Hanson) to approve this offer from Liz and wishes to thank her. Carried.
3. Pr. Meier has been asked to assist in the "Via de Christo" retreat in Crestwood, KY on August 26-29. Pr. Meier feels this will be a rewarding opportunity for her. David Wigginton will officiate at the weekend services. At a future date, Pr. Meier suggests a representative from "Via de Christo" speak to the congregation about this program. The council approves Pr. Meier's request to participate in this retreat.
4. Pr. Meier requests vacation to attend her daughter's ordination in SC. She will be out of town from 6/14 through 6/20. Rev. G. Mercer will officiate at the weekend's services. Council approves this vacation time to share this important event with her family.
5. Regan Morris has been attending the monthly visits to the Ronald McDonald house. She is requesting permission to hold a car wash on the church's property with all funds raised going to the support of the Ronald McDonald House. No date has been selected. Council approves this request by Regan. Please watch for the date(s) for this worthy cause.

**President's Report: D. Wigginton**

1. Council president reports the attendance through June 13 averaged 101 for all weekend services. This is the same average through this date as last year.
2. The council president discussed the ongoing stewardship campaign. Volunteer council member(s) will continue to work on the proposal to make stewardship a year- long emphasis.

1. Since Halloween falls on Sunday evening this coming fall, there will be no trunk and treat event at the church this year.

**Stewardship: G. Carstens**

1. Cheryl Markley has tabulated the time and talent forms returned and now has a list of members who fill worship and church service roles. If you do not find your name listed, contact Cheryl in the church's office.

**Fellowship:**

1. A church picnic is being planned for October 9. Be sure you mark this on your calendar as a must attend fall event.

**Worship and Music: B. Firquin**

1. The brass flower vases in the sanctuary will be repaired by Herb Warren.
2. Discussion of the Weight Watchers sign on the rental property lawn. The council noted that group pays a monthly fee for the use of the building and gave a donation to update the sign. The sign was moved from the front lawn to the rental property next to the entrance driveway. The council saw no reason to remove the sign due to the good relationship we have built with this group.
3. Tim Watts has requested the purchase of a fan to be located in the organ/piano/choir area. The sun heats this area very quickly during the summer months. Herb will investigate and get prices for purchase.
4. The council discussed the "Unfailing Light Service", scheduled for June 26, a Saturday evening at 7:00 p.m. It was suggested a banner be purchased to be placed in the front lawn in hopes it would encourage the community to attend this special service. The committee chair and property chair will work on getting the banner and placing it in the lawn.
5. July 4<sup>th</sup> falls on a Sunday this year. No special service is planned but patriotic and national hymns will be used in the service (9:30

a.m.) where appropriate. The suggested and seasonal bible readings and message will be used. Pr. Meier and the Worship and Music chair will plan the music used for this service.

### Property and Grounds: H. Warren

1. Bids to remove the large wild cherry tree on the property line at the rear of the parking lot continue to be reviewed. The lowest bid to take down, remove all limbs, grind the stump and clean-up is \$750.00. The chair person recommends having the tree removed for not more than \$750.00. The homeowner who shares this property line has made drastic improvements to his property and we do not want the tree, which is on our property, if it falls to damage his improvements creating a libel issue for the church. Passed by voice vote.
2. The memorial garden work will begin in the near future. H. Warren with plans and planting from Mr. Merritt Blow will be supervising this work. If you can help, please contact Herb.
3. Discussion of the monetary cost of equipment upkeep as well as the cost in time for volunteers to continue to cut the grass on the property. The council suggests Herb get some bids from lawn care companies for cutting the grass for future consideration as a budget item. If you have not signed up to cut the grass and can help, please sign up in the Narthex.

### Christian Education: T. Utley

1. VBS is quickly coming. The light meals prior to the evening activities that week have been planned. Meals will be served beginning at 5:30 pm. A free will offering will be collected each evening to help defray some of the costs of the meals. If you would like to make a donation directly to this, contact Tammy Utley or Kay Bunner.

### Social Ministries: J. Morani

1. A special social ministries offering will be collected the weekends of July 18 and July 25. St. Stephen has done an excellent job of meeting our commitment to FCHUM this year and this offering will continue that support of that work.
2. As FCHUM approaches the end of their fiscal year (July) the ministries finds itself on much firmer financial footing when compared to previous years. With continued support from local congregations, additional support from LG&E, Louisville Water Company, and General Electric as well as strengthened support from the Metro Council, FCHUM has been able to respond to the need in a very tight economic climate. All the staff at FCHUM thanks everyone for the outpouring of food, gifts, school supplies, money, time, and effort this year. The 2010-2011 budget is being finalized and will be reported when approved by the executive board of FCHUM.

1. Jr. Youth will have a swim party on June 27th.

### Special Committees

1. The chair of the call committee, Brenda Firquin, will continue to have updates in the monthly newsletters. Due to the need for confidentiality, these updates include the only information that can be distributed to the congregation. At this time, the committee continues the process of receiving names and working through the vetting process. They ask all members to continue to keep them and their most important work in your prayers.

1. Rod Firquin requested the finance committee consider making some payment to the I-K Synod for our budgeted benevolence. Currently, we have not offered any of the budgeted benevolence for this calendar year. This issue was discussed at the I-K Synod Assembly last weekend. The finance chair will have it as a discussion/action item on the next finance meeting agenda.




