I give God thanks for the blessing of that neighborhood church. They shared the Good News of Jesus with Jack even though he wasn't a member of their church or even of their denomination. And they knew it was highly unlikely that Jack would ever become a member.

Thinking about VBS brings back wonderful memories. I remember riding to VBS in my mom's station wagon, the way my little legs stuck to the vinyl seats, and how hot it was. I remember how excited I was and how excited my brother, cousins, and our friends were. We loved VBS. I remember playing games with Mrs. Seibert, eating cookies, and drinking bug juice in the church yard. I remember singing "Jesus Loves Me" as loudly as we could during the opening, and of course learning more about God's love.

I also remember and give God thanks for the folks who showered me with love – both theirs and God's. I give God thanks for Mrs. Ridgeway, Mrs. Seibert, Mrs. Clawson, Mr. and Mrs. Klein, my own mom, Pastor Stuck and for the others who planned, prepared, and led VBS at Trinity Lutheran Church in Richmond, IN during the 1970's and 80's. They taught me so much about God's love and grace, and they helped me to grow in my Christian faith.

This year VBS at Saint Stephen will be from Monday, July 9th – Friday, July 13th from 5:30 pm – 8:30 pm. Our theme is Sky: everything is possible with God. We will have supper together followed by singing, activities, Bible stories, snacks, games, and of course lots of fun.

I encourage you to invite a guest or eight to join us for VBS. You don't have to have little ones to bring a child to VBS. Invite a child from the neighborhood or invite a friend's child or grandchild.

June 10th, 2012

A Quorum was established for the regular meeting of the congregation council.

Meeting was called to order by council president, Brenda Firquin and opening prayer was offered by Pr. Kerri McFarland.

Members present: Connie Miller, Rita Sarson, Tammy Utley, Herb Warren, Joe Kiser, Bill Thompson, Pr. Kerri McFarland, Brenda Firquin, Rod Firquin (recording secretary). Members absent: Cheryl Markley, Joe Kirschbaum, Kenna Markley (youth representative)

Change in meeting agenda: The council president requested a change in the council meeting agenda, moving the Old and New business items to just after the financial reports. Committee reports would follow any new business items. Council agrees to change.

Special Presentation: Pr. McFarland discussed a potential proposal to construct stained glass windows for the windows in the sanctuary. Ken von Roann of Architectural Glass Art, was scheduled to discuss the design with the council, but was unable to attend the meeting. Pr. McFarland will contact the artist to reschedule the presentation at a later date.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the May (held April 23rd) were printed in June newsletter. M/S (H. Warren/T. Utley) to accept as printed. Carried.

Pastor's Report: Pr. Kerri

- 1. Pr. Kerri will be on vacation beginning June 11-17th. Rev. Joe Kiser will officiate at weekend services June 16th.
- Pr. Kerri will provide a more in depth report on the KY/IN Synod conference to the congregation and council, but expressed appreciation to Rita and Steve Sarson for attending and representing St. Stephen at the conference. The theme of the conference centered on the concept of why the church exists and what we as members of the church at large should be doing to carry out God's will in the world.

President's Report: B. Firquin

- 1. Attendance- 14 members, plus one visitor attended the first Sunday evening worship service. The visitor reported to Pr. Kerri that he saw the 5 pm worship time on the sign on the front lawn earlier in the week and came to this service. The council will continue to monitor the attendance at this service with the hopes it will provide opportunity for worship growth.
- 2. The new computer has been installed and programs/hardware loaded so the office work can continue. The church secretary and council president have been working diligently to get all programs used to support the church's worship, finance, and outreach up and running as quickly as possible and within reasonable costs. So far, things are going smoothly and hopefully all computer systems will be back in working order soon. The church website has been updated with a contact button added. Worship and Music: B. Firquin

- If you have not had your new picture made for the membership wall, Michelle Sarson will have her camera at church on June 24 and July 8. Please make yourselves available if you have not already updated your individual or family picture. We want to bring this informational board up to date.

Property and Grounds: H. Warren

1. The recent hail did extensive damage to the roofs of the buildings on the church property. Our insurance carrier has approved replacement of ALL the roofs on all of the buildings on the property, with a total initial replacement cost of \$29,348.00. After meeting with several roofing contractors who are equipped to handle a job of this scope, A Southern Roofing, a local company, has been selected to complete the work. The company has agreed to donate the \$1,000.00 deductible back to the church. Work should begin soon and be completed as not to interfere with any services. Updates as the work moves forward and any future claims due to storm damage will be forthcoming. A Southern Roofing has also offered a \$100 donation to the church in the name of any member who has their roof replaced by this company. To participate, notify A Southern that you would like the \$100 donation to the church in your name. A sample copy of the donation certificate will appear in the July newsletter.

Christian Education: T. Utley

Stewardship Perspective and Picnic Reminder

I am writing to you as the St. Stephen financial chair and as a member of the stewardship committee. As the financial chair, I spend a lot of time either rejoicing over or worrying about St. Stephen's ability to continue to pay its bills. It is tedious to write and to listen to financial updates every month, but it is one of the measures of our church's success, like it or not. It is a reflection of the financial health of our members, but more importantly, it is a reflection of how we feel about our church, its mission, our fellow members, our leadership, and our church's ministry.

Last year before the stewardship campaign, we appeared to be in dire straights with respect to the rapid decline in St. Stephen's mortgage fund. It was a relief to share St. Stephen's financial position with other members so that we could all share the burden of that reality. It was an even bigger relief to see the positive response that resulted. Everyone needs to be thanked for their commitment to the church, and I hope that the trend continues, especially through the summer. I hope that we can also make it possible to pay our benevolence contribution to the synod. We have not been able to the benevolence contribution expected of a church our size since we started paying the current mortgage.

I find that making a financial contribution to the church makes me feel like a part of the church family, which also means that I feel like I need to contribute to the work of our church family. There are many ways that that members can serve. I have served as a worship server, a council member, and a finance committee member among other jobs. There are jobs for everyone. If we generously share the work of the church, no single person should be overburdened, and there should be a job for everyone.

On **Sunday, July 8th at the Stewardship Picnic after the 10:00 am worship service**, you will have the opportunity to sign up for some of those needed jobs within the church. We will have time and talent forms available and plenty of people to answer questions about jobs on the list. In addition, you will receive your 2012 six-month offering statement along with your sealed covenant pledge (if you returned one) so that you may check the progress of your personal financial contribution. The Stewardship Committee will provide the hot dogs and drinks. We are asking you to bring a side dish or dessert. Please see the sign up sheet in the Gathering Area so that we will know how many hot dogs to buy. See you there!


