The face that may have been strange and intolerable to me is transformed into the face of one for whom Christ died" in and through prayer.

Prayer is powerful. It matters. Prayer changes lives.

Throughout the history of Christianity, the season of Lent has been a time set aside for contemplation and prayer. On Wednesday, March 11<sup>th</sup> Saint Stephen will be having a prayer vigil. The prayer vigil will take place in the church library (the old narthex). You are encouraged to sign-up for one or two of the time slots on the poster in the narthex or to simply drop in as your schedule permits. This can be time for prayer, reflection, repentance, thanksgiving, or simply a quiet time to be with your Lord.



# St. Stephen Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting

**February 8, 2015** 

The regular meeting of the council was called to order by council president, Brenda Firquin. A quorum was established. Pr. McFarland opened the meeting with prayer.

Members present: Brenda Firquin, Cheryl Markley, Connie Miller, Larry Faue, Buddy Zimmerman, Bill Thompson, Rita Sarson, Kenna Markley (youth), Paul Kiser, Pastor McFarland, Rod Firquin (recording secretary). Members absent: Andrea Goebel

**Secretary's Report**: The minutes of the January meeting were printed in the February newsletter.

M/S-B. Thompson/B. Zimmerman to accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter.

#### Pastor's Report: Pr. McFarland

1. Lenten service schedule was presented. The services have been printed in the newsletter and bulletins. All members are encouraged to attend and be involved in the worship and fellowship leading up to Easter.

#### President's Report: B. Firquin

1. January weekend attendance averages 82. Last weekend attendance was 99, including approximately 10 from St. Alban's.

#### Financial Reports: P. Markley, B. Wise, B. Zimmerman

1. The January treasurer's report was presented and discussed. M/S- L. Faue/C. Miller. Carried. See report printed at the end of the minutes.

#### Old Business:

- 1. Another contact has been made by the realtor, representing the developer, of the property just south of the church's property. There is still interest in purchasing a small strip of our property. At this time no offer or negotiation has been discussed. The council will be updated if/when this moves forward.
- 2. Cheryl Markley presented the draft of the annual meeting packet. The agenda and reports were approved to be presented to the congregation.
- 3. One of the fundraising suggestions discussed at the January meeting was a seasonal/event basket auction. Paul Kiser has put together a list of possible basket themes. The live auction will be held on Palm Sunday, March 29th following the 10:00 am service. Look for a list of baskets members can "adopt" and put together individually or members can donate items to help complete a basket. The council is very excited about the suggestions congregation members offered at the budget workshop in January. This is the first one of a number of events planned for the coming year. The youth will provide a light luncheon during the auction. It is hoped the luncheon will encourage many members to stay and even invite guests to participate in the basket auction and fellowship.
- 4. The 2015 Budget proposal was presented with no changes to the draft presented in the January council meeting. M/S- L. Faue/P. Kiser to accept as presented. Carried. This budget will be recommended to the congregation at the annual meeting on February 22 following the 10:00 am worship service.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. The audit of all the church's financial records was completed on February 4. All accounts were found to be in very good condition. The treasurer, financial secretary, and finance chairperson and finance committee are to be commended for their diligence in keeping the financial matters of the church very clear, clean, and precise.
- 2. A blood drive has been set for June. An exact date has not been selected by the American Red Cross. When the date is determined, it will be announced immediately so all donors can make plans to donate. Our goal will be 15 successful donations.
- 3. Another fundraiser event will be held on July 25. It is being called a "Kentucky Tasting Event". Plans are still being made, but initial discussions involve tastings of all things Kentucky. Just think of all the things brewed, distilled, grown, produced, and made in our Commonwealth. If you are interested in helping plan and carry out this new event, please contact Brenda Firguin.
- 4. Another discussion at the January budget workshop involved making additional payments on the building mortgage. After much discussion, the council entertained a motion addressing this issue. The following motion was made by Larry Faue: At the close of the 2015 calendar year, the amount in excess of 6 months payments in the mortgage fund account (\$6,456.00) and what is in excess of \$10,000.00 in the annex (rental house) account will be paid directly on the principal of the mortgage. This motion was seconded by Paul Kiser and carried by voice vote of the council.

- 2. Thanks to all who provided food for Marian Gerwick's reception at the church following her funeral.

#### Worship and Music: B. Firquin

- 1. The council wishes to thank Jim Brotzge for his design and construction of the advent candle and oil candle holders. Jim is a skilled and gifted wood worker. Thanks Jim for your work.
- The Good Friday service will be held in the Fellowship Hall. The service will utilize the Biblical passages for each of the Stations
  of the Cross. The artwork is on display in the Fellowship Hall. Look for more information on this service as Good Friday approaches.
- 3. A 24 Hour prayer vigil is being planned for March 11. It has been a number of years since St. Stephen has held a prayer vigil and the committee hopes this will add to the Lenten season of prayer and reflection on God's love and sacrifice. Look for more details soon on how members can participate.
- 4. The committee reports very positive feedback from congregation members on the children's Christmas tree in the Fellowship Hall. The ornaments were made by the Sunday school children with great love and pride.

#### **ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING MINUTES**

February 22, 2015

The annual congregational meeting of St. Stephen Lutheran Church was called to order following the 10:00 A.M. service and the chili cook-off fellowship by Council President Brenda Firquin. A quorum was established with approximately 40 members present. Pr. Kerri McFarland offered prayer to open the meeting.

The meeting packet was distributed prior to the close of the fellowship to allow those in attendance to review the reports included and the minutes from the 2014 annual meeting. Motion by Pat Markley and seconded by Paul Kiser to approve the minutes as printed in the packet. Carried by voice vote.

Reporting for the Council Nominating Committee the following names were placed in nomination for the vacancies on the 2015 Council:

Michelle Sarson- 3 year term and Duane Steines- 3 year term. No other names were placed in nomination from the floor. Motion by Buddy Zimmerman and seconded by Janette Constantino to accept the names placed in nomination to fill the vacancies on the council. The names nominated were elected by voice vote.

Written reports from the various committees were included in the meeting packet. Each chairperson or representative was available to highlight the reports and answer questions. Written reports were as follows:

Council President Brenda Firquin noted in her report the quarterly finance workshops hosted by the council and finance committee during 2014. The council believes these discussions have given congregation members an opportunity to participate in financial decisions and offer suggestions for budgetary decisions not only for 2014, but for 2015 and beyond. The president thanked all who attended these meetings.

Pr. McFarland noted in her report St. Stephen has welcomed 21 new members in 2014. She also highlighted the numerous ways God has worked through the members of St. Stephen to support ministry outreaches as well as opportunities to welcome the community into our church through VBS, trunk and treat, and support of FCHUM. The church is strong and vibrant in the Fern Creek community and we will look for other ways to show God's love through our work and worship.

Buddy Zimmerman, Treasurer, reported 2014 ended on a very positive note. All accounts showed positive balances after all expenses were met for the year. Giving exceeded expenses, which is an excellent record going forward. Buddy noted the \$2,000.00 transferred from the money market account (mission investment fund) in January 2014 to the general fund, has been replaced.

It was noted during the Christian Education report that this year's VBS will begin on a Sunday night and complete on Thursday night. It was noted the Friday night attendance has been in decline for a number of years. It is believed many families leave town on Friday evenings which impacts the attendance. This change will be monitored and discussed for future VBS planning.

Rita Sarson rotates off the council this year after serving two three year terms. She will continue to chair the Evangelism committee and Michelle Sarson will report the committee's work to the council.

The Membership report shows 21 members received during the year, 12 by affirmation of faith, 6 by baptism, and 3 by transfer; 6 members were removed, 2 by death and 4 by transfer to other congregations. Total baptized membership reported as 272 and total confirmed membership reported as 211. Average weekend attendance, not including Easter was reported at 87.

Connie Miller reported a very busy year for the Fellowship committee. Of special note was the installation of the ceiling fan in the kitchen in memory of Kay Bunner.

Pat Markley reported that the Finance Chairman's report includes good news. Net income showed a \$2,680.53 positive balance, meaning actual expenses were under projected budget amounts. It was noted we did not meet the budget benevolence amount and that fact has been addressed in the 2015 budget proposal. Mr. Markley encourages the congregation to continue the trends in giving throughout the year, especially during the summer months when attendance normally drops as well as giving.

Property and Grounds chairperson, Rod Firquin, reported the wooden parts of the building were painted this summer. Only a small high eve portion still needs completion, which will happen in the early spring. Overall, the grounds, church building, and rental house are in good shape. Replacement windows were installed in the rental house this summer. As noted in the finance report, the rental house continues to generate income. Some landscaping, tree trimming, and driveway gravel work is planned for the spring and summer.

Pr. McFarland reported on the Social Ministries work for the year. We continue to provide financial and food pantry support for FCHUM. The annual FCHUM gala is held every May and this past year St. Stephen won the penny challenge with \$377.00 donated. During Lent, \$400.00 was collected for ELCA World Hunger Relief. Walkers representing St. Stephen raised \$225.00 for the DARE TO CARE hunger walk in September. Many thanks to Charlie and Phyllis Boston for transporting all of our donations to FCHUM.

The Worship and Music committee, chaired by Brenda Firquin, had a very busy year. It was noted two services were held on Easter morning. Both were well received and well attended. The chairperson made special mention of our pianist and music director Hank Evans. His talent, dedication, and enthusiasm have added greatly to our worship and fellowship. His talented group of friends has added much to our fellowship activities and we look forward to many more opportunities to enjoy Hank's talents.

The Financial Audit was completed and all accounts were found to be in excellent order. It was noted the paper trail was very clear concerning the theft of payroll and blank checks from the church office. No accounts were negatively impacted due to Buddy's quick action in dealing with this issue.

The annex (rental house) while showing a negative income stream for 2014 continues to be an income producing property for the church. As noted, replacement windows were installed with the cost coming from the annex account. Other church expenses were paid from the annex account during the year as well (tree removal, yard work, and operating expenses.)

Paul Kiser discussed the church's involvement in the South Central Conference of the IN/KY Synod. He is representing St. Stephen on this committee of regional Lutheran congregations. Note the budgeted amount in benevolence giving to this conference. Paul will continue to keep the council and membership updated on the work of this group.

More detailed reports are included in the annual report packet.

A motion was made by Tammy Utley and seconded by Fred McBride to accept the committee reports as printed in the meeting packet. Carried by voice vote.

There was no Old Business.

The 2015 proposed budget was presented by Pat Markley. This budget was recommended by the council after discussion at the last financial workshop in January. No salary increases were proposed in the budget, but an increase in ministerial health care affected the overall budget. It was noted the council has committed the total budgeted amount for benevolence to be paid in full. It is planned to pay this total on a quarterly basis. Charlie Boston asked why the utilities budget did not cover the 2014 actual expenditure and should this be changed. He offered this in a form of a motion and was seconded by Buddy Zimmerman. That motion carried by a voice vote. The 2015 budget will reflect \$8,695.00 as expected expenditure in the utilities line. This change will increase the overall budget to \$153,198.00. A motion was offered by Marcus Utley and seconded by Duane Steines to accept the proposed/recommended budget with the change noted above. Carried by a voice vote.

The council president offered closing remarks. She thanked outgoing council members Bill Thompson and Rita Sarson for their devoted and thoughtful service to the church through their work on the council. She also reported yearly average attendance for the 10:00 am service was 74 and the 5:00 pm service was 9. The council plans to continue to hold quarterly meetings to keep the congregation informed on the financial health of the church. Many fundraising and fellowship events are being planned as a result of input from the congregation. Watch for upcoming announcements about these events and participate as often and as much as you are able. Finally, the council at the last regular meeting passed a motion to address the mortgage balance on the sanctuary. At the close of the 2015 budget year, any funds in excess of 6 months mortgage payments in the mortgage fund and any amount in excess of \$10.000.00 in the annex (rental property) account will be paid directly to the principle on the mortgage. It is hoped this will begin a focused effort to pay the mortgage off by the 10 year anniversary in 2017.

A motion by Fred McBride and seconded by Herb Warren to adjourn the annual meeting was carried by voice vote.

It was announced that the new chili cook-off champion is ..... Rita Sarson. There were 9 excellent chili dishes in the competition this year. We look forward to Rita defending her championship next year.
