Grace to you and peace from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

It is time to start making your plans to attend in the 2015 Fern Creek-Highview United Ministries Gala on Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.

The Gala is the Fern Creek-Highview United Ministries' biggest fundraiser every year. Last year the Gala raised \$27,000. Thanks to generous donations from local businesses and area churches the cost of the Gala was merely \$300. This meant \$26,700 went straight into helping people in need.

The money raised does powerful things in our community and blesses the lives of so many folks. This March, FCHUM helped 350 families with groceries which means, they helped feed 1,111 hungry people who live right here in our community. Of those people, 433 were children and 95 were seniors. 42 families received help paying their electric bills, 1 with medical bills, 8 with water bills, 6 with rent, and lots of families received donated clothing. The Adult Day Center provided care for 32 older adults living with dementia or Alzheimer's.

You are invited to be a part of this amazing ministry. Some ways you can support the work of FCHUM:

Purchase a \$25.00 ticket from Pastor Kerri and join in the fun of the Gala on Saturday, May 9<sup>th.</sup> Last year the fellowship was delightful, the food amazing, and the auction competitive. The Food Shelf is completely out of essentials you use every day like toothpaste, soap, dish liquid, laundry detergent, and toilet paper. They are very low on shampoo and deodorant. They always need peanut butter, canned chicken, spaghetti and sauce, stew, and ravioli.

You could volunteer at FCHUM. They love helping hands and smiling faces.

# **Sunday School Teacher Appreciation Breakfast**



#### Secretary's Report:

The minutes of the March meeting were printed in the April newsletter. M/S- A. Goebel/D. Steines to accept minutes as printed.

Carried.

#### Pastor's Report: Pr. McFarland

- 1. Pr. McFarland will be on vacation Monday, April 27 through Sunday May 3. Pastor Joe Kiser will officiate at both services in Pr. McFarland's absence.
- 2. Pr. McFarland announced she will be volunteering to be the director's assistant at the reading camp at Lutheran Hills near Columbus, IN. She will be at the camp from Friday, June 12 Friday, June 19. Pr. McFarland is working out plans for a supply pastor or will work with the youth to lead the Sunday services.
- 3. The Morani family officially transferred their membership from St. Stephen to Our Savior.
- 4. Bob and Cathy Meyer will be joining St. Stephen's congregation on May 24. Please make sure you welcome them to our faith community.
- 5. Emily Goebel will be confirmed on May 24th.
- 6. The meetings among St. Stephen, St. Albans and Messiah/Trinity continue. The last meeting was held on April 9. All are welcome to attend as we see to explore how each congregation can support the other in the ministry in Fern Creek. Watch for more information as these groups plan some cooperative events in the near future.
- 7. Bishop Gafkjen will be visiting Louisville on Tuesday, April 14. He will be hosting a Question/Answer Gathering of local Lutherans at Third Lutheran Church, 1864 Frankfort Ave. The topic will be "Who is welcome to the Holy communion table?" If you are interested in attending, contact Pr. McFarland.
- 8. The KY/IN Synod convention will be held in Indianapolis on Saturday, June 6 and Sunday, June 7. St. Stephen has not had lay representation at a convention for a number of years. It would be wonderful if a couple of members could attend. If you are interested, please contact Pastor McFarland.
- 9. Old church vacuum cleaners will become donations to the church yard sale. A new vacuum has been purchased recently.

#### President's Report: B. Firquin

- 1. Average attendance through March is 90 per weekend.
- 2. It was noted the Easter attendance was down from last year. Members felt the spring break from school beginning that weekend had an impact on the attendance.
- 3. On Sunday, April 26 at 6:30 PM, a community choir event will be held at St. Gabriel. Our choir will participate jointly with the choir from St. Albans. This is a free event with many area choirs participating. We hope to have a good representation from St. Stephen to support our choir and enjoy the evening of song and praise.

2. Sunday School teacher appreciation breakfast will be held on May 17. Thanks to all who support our Sunday School staff as they plan and teach the weekly lessons to both youth and adults. Your dedication is a gift to our congregation.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. The first quarter financial update will be presented to the congregation next Sunday, April 19. Buddy Zimmerman will provide the quarterly report to those in attendance at the 10:00 am service and discuss details. There will be a congregation information meeting to present and discuss the mid- year (2<sup>nd</sup> quarter) financial report on July 12, following the 10:00 am service. Quarterly reports were promised to the congregation at the annual congregational meeting. It is hoped these updates will keep all members informed of the current status of the financial matters of the church.
- 2. Buddy Zimmerman reported an anonymous Easter gift from a member. After discussion, a motion (D. Steines) was made and seconded (A. Goebel) to deposit the entire gift into the mission investment fund. This is the investment account for the church. If needed, these funds can be accessed immediately.
- 3. A motion was made (B. Zimmerman) and seconded (M. Sarson) to direct all proceeds from the upcoming yard sale to the mortgage/building fund. Carried.
- 4. The council discussed communication between congregation members and council members. The council asks members who have concerns, problems with current church issues, or any other questions to bring them to the attention of the council president, pastor, or other council member and allow the council time to address the issue. This line of communication will assist the council in addressing member concerns in a timely manner.

#### Evangelism: M. Sarson

- 1. The "blessing bags" will be available again this summer. These are zip lock bags filled with toiletry items church members can keep in their cars. They can then be given to anyone in need as we go about our daily travels. Lots of good feedback on this outreach was received last year and we hope many more will participate this year.
- 2. New visitor bags will be put together in the coming months.
- 3. Watch for information on the ELCA's "God's work....our Hands" community outreach efforts scheduled for September 13. Plans are being formulated for how St. Stephen can participate in this ministry to the community.

#### Worship and Music: B. Firquin

1. The last meeting was cancelled due to weather related issues. The next meeting will be in May.

#### Property and Grounds: R. Firguin

1. LG&E conducted an energy audit in the rental house. The report indicated the front door is in need of replacement and at no cost to the church or tenant, the door will be replaced in the near future.

- 2. A new sump pump was installed in the rental house prior to the last big spring rains. The new one is larger and works more efficiently than the temporary replacement installed last fall.
- 3. It was noted a pothole has appeared in parking lot just outside the old narthex entrance as well as at the parking lot entrance off Bardstown Road. These holes will be repaired as the weather allows for proper preparation and filling.
- 4. The tractor is operating well at this time. Two mower deck wheels are in need of replacement. R. Firquin and H. Warren will investigate the replacement at the lowest cost.
- 5. There are many open weeks on the mowing schedule. There is a small group who has been diligent in making sure the grounds are mowed and looking good not only for our members but for the community. If you can give a few hours to one of those members who is signed up, it would cut down the time it takes to cut the grass, trim, and clean sidewalks. Or if you could put together a group of workers, let Rod know and he can arrange to meet your group here to assist in any way. The flower beds are also in need of attention, so again, if you have a few hours during the week, please pitch in to help the property and grounds to remain the most beautiful green space along the business section of Bardstown Road.
