Members absent: Connie Miller, Buddy Zimmerman.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the September 13, 2015 meeting were printed in the October newsletter. D. Steines / L. Faue motion and second to accept the minutes as printed. Carried.

Pastor's Report: Pr. McFarland

- 1. The stewardship campaign is in progress. Time and talent sheets will be out soon. All members are asked to prayerfully consider how each of us can share our talents, gifts, and time to serve God's people. Many small acts of support and outreach can make a big difference in the church and community. Please fill out the sheets and return them to the designated place.
- 2. St. Alban's members have been joining us in worship the last few months. They plan on visiting on November 8, December 6 and January 24. Please welcome them into our worship and extend a hand of friendship and support.
- 3. Pr. McFarland informed the council she is in the early stages of application for a Lilly Corporation grant to receive a clergy renewal sabbatical. Pastor will provide much more information to the council and the congregation as the process goes forward. The grant is to support clergy as they renew their commitments to their church and the work of the Lord.
