# St. Stephen Lutheran Congregational Council Meeting September 14, 2014

The regular meeting of the council was called to order at 11:35 a.m. by the council president, Brenda Firquin. A quorum was established. Pr. McFarland opened the meeting with prayer.

Members present: B. Firquin, C. Markley, C. Miller, A. Goebel, L. Faue, B. Zimmerman, P. Kiser, Pr. McFarland, R. Firquin-recording secretary. Members absent: B. Thompson, R. Sarson, K. Markley (youth)

### Secretary's Report:

The minutes of the August meeting were printed in the September newsletter. M/S- A. Goebel/P. Kiser to accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter. Carried.

The council president requested the agenda of the meeting be amended to allow members to attend the Dare to Care Hunger Walk. The president's report, the pastor's report, and church committee reports will be sent to the recording secretary for inclusion in the minutes. There are some important new business items that need attention and with the need to hold the meeting to one hour, it is requested the agenda be amended to include only financial reports, and new business. M/S- P. Kiser/A. Goebel. Carried.

#### **New Business:**

- The called congregational meeting is called for September 21 following the 10:00 a.m. service. Pat Markley will be providing a financial update to the members in attendance, which was promised at the June 1 meeting. The initial report to the council is giving has remained steady over the summer, even with the drop in attendance which usually occurs. There have been gifts to the memorial fund which will show in the overall cash assets. It appears giving has improved into the general fund (operating expenses) but the mortgage fund giving has dropped off. The meeting on the 21st will highlight this information as well as specific areas of financial interest. The council discussed a possible quarterly congregational meeting/fellowship in 2015 to keep the congregation updated on financial matters and other issues as they arise. The 2015 council will discuss this.
- A family member of a congregation member has requested to park his commercial equipment on the church's property. After discussion the council feels this is not in the best interest of the church and there could be liability issues involved with parking non-church vehicles on the lot. M/S to deny the request. B.Zimmerman/C.Miller. Carried. B.Zimmerman will make contact with the person making the request.
- The real estate agent representing the owner/developer of the property just south of the church has contacted Pr. McFarland and Rod Firquin with an interest in purchasing a small strip of adjoining land to expand parking for a potential buyer. While the agent said this is in a very preliminary stage, the potential buyer would need the space to make his current plan feasible. R. Firquin discussed potential issues the church might have with selling to an occupant that would have weekend hours and/or create a traffic issue around our service times. He also expressed a concern about the proposal making the south side of the church exposed to persons using the parking lot after hours of the business. The agent was not at liberty to discuss who the potential occupant might be, but did say he would clarify the hours of expected operation. At this time, he said he has been approached almost weekly about selling/leasing the corner of the land that was designated as a 6-8 suite, two story office type complex in the original plan. The council has designated Rod Firquin as the contact person for the council/church in this matter. No discussion of price or even time line was discussed. Much more information as well as MSD involvement would occur before the congregation would be asked to approve selling this strip of land to the developer.
- St. Stephen has been approached by a local day care, which is losing its building lease, about procuring space in our building to continue operation. Pr. McFarland and B. Firquin visited the current site to meet the owner/operator and discuss her needs. She has also visited St. Stephen to see if our building could meet her needs. At this point this is only a preliminary discussion to determine suitability of our building for a state approved day care. Many requirements for state approval would have to be met before this matter could be considered further. A decision to enter into contract with this type or any other business to use our building would require congregational approval.
- The finance committee is requesting congregational input in building of the 2015 budget. Given the 2014 finance situation, each budget line needs to be discussed and prioritized as to the mission of St. Stephen. The finance committee and the council have set November 9, following the 10:00 a.m. worship service as a "finance/budget workshop". The committee and council agree that creating a budget is an issue the entire congregation should have information about and be involved. There will be potluck lunch on the day of the meeting and a sign-up sheet will be in the Narthex to help in planning. Watch for more information about this meeting in October.

# St. Stephen Lutheran Specially-Called Congregation Meeting September 21, 2014

The special called congregation meeting was called to order by council president, Brenda Firquin. A quorum was established with 36 voting members present. Pr. McFarland led the members present in prayer.

Council president opened the meeting by presenting the agenda for the meeting, which was to share current financial information with the congregation. This meeting was discussed at the June 1, 2014 specially called congregation meeting to update financial information through the third quarter of the year.

Pat Markley, financial chairman, presented updated charts and graphs of the giving trends over the last 20 months. Since the last congregational meeting in June, actual cash account balances have gone up. However, while overall giving has increased, our mortgage fund giving has not kept up, and our mortgage fund account has fallen. It was noted the summer giving has remained steady when compared to the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, which is encouraging, since summer giving usually drops when attendance drops. Certainly, the congregation responded to the council's information about continuing to give when members do not attend. It was noted that nothing has been given to any benevolence that was budgeted(\$1,600.00) through August 2014. The current mortgage fund has approximately 4 payments in the account, with some memorial gifts designated for the fund not yet transferred into the fund. The current mortgage balance as of August is \$154,062.10. We are currently running behind in giving when compared to what is needed for the approved 2014 budget.

As we enter the last quarter of the year, members are reminded the current trends in giving need to continue to end the year on a good financial base.

During discussion members offered suggestions to raise more revenue for the church. It was noted the yard sale was not held this year because no one offered to chair an organizational committee to coordinate the event. It was suggested it is not too late to have a fall yard sale, but someone or some committee or group will need to step up to organize and coordinate the date and sale.

Other suggestions were offered: 1. Investigate rental of the building for parties, receptions, or other gatherings, 2. Love offering for the meal at Trunk or Treat, 3. A craft/yard sale renting spaces for vendors, 4. Continuing to grow membership, 5. Transferring available funds into an interest bearing account or investing in higher yield return product 6. A Mardi Gras/ Monte Carlo evening as a fundraiser.



# St. Stephen Cash Account Balances




