Church-wide Yard Sale Will Benefit ELW Hymnal Campaign

Plans are underway for a church-wide yard sale on **Saturday**, **September 24**, **from 9 am until 1 pm**. Proceeds from the yard sale will benefit the ELW hymnal campaign. We are requesting donations of all sorts of items for the yard sale, including household items, toys, tools, furniture, and more. We are <u>not</u> planning to include any clothing. Volunteers are needed to cover a wide range of tasks -- a sign-up sheet is in the narthex. To be successful, we will need everyone's help -- from advertising to pricing to working the day of the sale. Please see the sign-up sheet for specific tasks where your help is needed. All congregation members are encouraged to get involved.

Although the yard sale will benefit the ELW hymnal campaign, we are still accepting donations as well for the remainder of our 200-book goal (\$4500). As of August 21st, we are able to purchase **88** hymnals. Special envelopes are available with a place to designate hymnals purchased in memory or in honor of loved ones. **Cost is \$22.50 per book.** Our progress is being tracked on the bulletin board in the Gathering Area. Hymnals will be ordered soon. **We will begin using Setting 10 in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) hymnal on September 11th.**

St. Stephen's Financial Status

I wanted to bring our financial situation to everyone's attention. Through the month of July, our total income was \$78,396 while our total expenses for the same period have been \$99,583. Therefore, we have a net loss of \$21,187. We have been able to manage by using funds we carried over from last year. We are current on all of our bills. However, we have not yet been able to pay any of our benevolence to the Synod.

Our primary disconnect is our monthly mortgage. Our plan for this year was to pay the mortgage out of the building fund. Year to date, we have made \$12,380 in mortgage payments. Our monthly mortgage payment is \$1505. We have sufficient funds to continue to pay for the mortgage in this manner approximately half way through next year. Then we will have to start paying the mortgage out of the general fund.

Please consider this information when you are contemplating your giving to the church.

Why do you go to church?

News from the 2011 Churchwide Assembly in Orlando

Hello, fellow brothers and sisters in Christ,

Attending the 2011 Churchwide Assembly in Orlando was an uplifting experience, but it always feels good to come home. I rarely ventured outside during the event because **a.** I was too busy, **b.** it was beastly hot and humid in Orlando, and **c.** someone told me that there was an alligator living in the lagoon not too far from the parking lot.

I checked the site statistics for our "Companionable Conversations" blog and was delighted to see that 721 people viewed it during the course of the week. If you haven't had a chance to read it yet, we have decided to keep it active and add thoughts now that we've returned to Indiana and Kentucky. I am going to post some more photos and videos, so please check it occasionally in the coming weeks. I am grateful for those who contributed to the blog: Bishop Bill, Pr. Rudy Mueller, Kate Knoerzer and Christopher Burrus.

The worship services were inspiring and exhilarating, and the ELCA Global Mission young adult musicians offered songs and energetic dances from around the world. Among other things, I enjoyed getting to know some of our own voting members a bit better. On Friday, Bishop Mark Hanson introduced the newly-elected bishops since the last churchwide assembly so I was happy to see our Bishop Bill walk up to the front. I was also intrigued and in awe of the gorgeous work of nationally-known contemporary textile artist Linda Witte Henke, whose work had a gallery of its own in the worship space. Ms. Henke currently lives within the mission territory of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod.

Among the decisions and discussions at the assembly were:

- Approval of the <u>ELCA Malaria Campaign</u>
- Adoption of the <u>social statement on genetics</u>
- Approval of holding churchwide assembly every three years instead of two, beginning after the assembly in 2013
- Discussed and acted upon the <u>LIFT proposal</u>, "Living Into the Future Together," a plan to connect the structure of the church more closely to its mission
- Approval of a resolution on <u>bullying</u>

ELCA Secretary David Swartling reported that since the 2009 Churchwide Assembly, the ELCA has lost only approximately 5% of its congregations, leaving over 10,000 congregations on its roster, a comforting and reassuring number.

You will hear more from us in the coming weeks and months as we work to unwrap and disperse all the information, plans and ideas that we gathered during our week in Orlando.

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
