Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ -

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Welcoming visitors, guests, and strangers is one of the most important things we do as God's people in this world. In fact, the Bible tells us hospitality is a calling from God, but welcoming strangers and visitors doesn't always come naturally to us. Talking to folks we don't know can feel awkward and uncomfortable. We don't want to say or do the wrong thing. We worry the person really isn't a visitor, and we will look foolish. We think we aren't good at welcoming visitors or that welcoming visitors isn't our job.

It is easier to pretend we don't see the visitor sitting alone in worship. It takes less effort to greet the people we know well during the passing of the peace. It is much more comfortable to sit with our families and friends during coffee hour and assume the visitors will find someone else to talk to. It is a lot easier to assume Pastor Kerri will speak to the visitors, because it is her job. But the pastor shouldn't be the only person welcoming visitors to Saint Stephen. It is easier to say the evangelism committee or the assigned greeter will take care of it.

And yet, would you invite a guest into your home and not speak to her? Would you decide it was someone else's job to make your guests feel welcome? Would you ignore a visitor sitting in your living room? Would you overlook a guest at your supper table? Of course not. None of us would ignore a guest in our homes. So we shouldn't ignore our guests at church either. After all, we invited them to join us for worship. We asked them to be our guests. We told them they were welcome here. It says so quite clearly on the sign out front.

God tells us our visitors should feel like honored guests. They should feel welcome, wanted, and included, but too often we miss the mark. I often see our visitors sitting alone in worship. Or new members sitting alone during coffee hour. Or guests hanging out by themselves in the sanctuary before worship. Think about how awkward the passing of the peace would feel if only one or two people shared the peace of the Lord with you. Would you really enjoy coffee hour if no one welcomed you or spoke to you?

It takes courage to visit a new church. Walking through those doors into the unknown isn't easy.

The good news is we can make our visitors and new members feel welcome and at home here by doing just a few things. First, we need to remember every single member of Saint Stephen is a host and not a guest. Making visitors feel welcome is God's call to everyone. The most important person for a visitor to talk to in order to feel at home in a new church is you. It isn't the pastor, the greeter, or someone from the Evangelism Committee, but a regular attender.

We should treat our visitors as guests of the Lord, and not strangers. We should take the initiative rather than waiting for visitors to start a conversation. We need to take the time to listen, to learn about our guests, to learn their names, and remember them. Introduce yourself not just once or twice, but lots of times. If we really are welcoming, our visitors will have lots and lots of new names to remember so a reminder of who you are can be a wonderful blessing.

Don't leave our guests sitting alone in worship, or standing alone in the narthex, or sipping their coffee alone in the fellowship hall during coffee hour. Offer to give folks a quick tour of the church. Show them the bathrooms, the nursery, and the fellowship hall.

Tell folks you are glad they are here, and pray for them throughout the week.

God has called us to welcome strangers, visitors, and guests with open hearts. You are the right person for the job.

May God bless you and keep you today and always.

Church Building Security

When you are entering the church building, please make sure you are locking the doors of the church as you enter the building. The doors closest to the church offices should never be left unlocked for any reason for safety purposes.

Members and staff continue to find the church empty and unlocked which is incredibly dangerous. Just recently the church was left unlocked until after 10:00 pm on a Friday evening and again during the middle of the day. Please take the time to double check that you have locked the doors. If we continue to find the church unlocked, we are going to have to have the locks changed and limit the people who can have keys to the building. Doing this would be both expensive and inconvenient.

The church council also wants to remind and encourage you to lock your cars when you are at church and to remove all of your valuables from your cars. People have been seen strolling through the church parking lot looking into cars more than once recently.

Direct Deposits for Church Contributions

During the special congregational meeting on June 1st, several people mentioned that they would like to be able to do a direct deposit for their church offering. This sounded like a good idea to help the church receive offerings when members were not able to attend services. However, the St. Stephen finance committee learned from the bank that they would charge the church account \$50 per month for this direct deposit service. The finance committee would like to avoid that fee, so the bank recommended that members who want to set up an automatic payment plan set up a reoccurring bill payment plan with their own bank and checking account to have their checks sent automatically directly to the church. With this option, you can choose when and how often the church receives your offering. This also keeps the church from paying any extra fees. Thank you for your continued support.

Operation Christmas Child

We've started our annual collection for Operation Christmas Child. As many of you know, these shoeboxes of non-liquid toiletries, school supplies, toys, and candy are sent by Samaritan's Purse to children in war zones, disaster zones, and areas of extreme poverty all over the world. This shoebox may be the only gift that some of these children receive for Christmas. After we collect the shoeboxes here at the church, they are taken to a local relay center where they are loaded onto semi-trailer trucks and taken to one of the 8 national distribution centers. There, volunteers add a booklet about the life of Jesus written in the language of the recipient country. From the distribution centers, the boxes are taken via many creative modes of transportation to children who can't wait to receive those boxes.

Operation Christmas Child brochures and information are available on a table in the narthex. You are asked to either wrap the lids and boxes separately (so that they may be opened), or line a clear plastic shoebox with wrapping paper or a bandana or other fabric, or use an opaque plastic shoebox. Secure the shoebox with a rubber band. Lists of suggested items as well as items that should be avoided will be available. Please do not include liquids, perishables, war toys, or anything that could be used as a weapon. Colorful items can really brighten the world that some of these children are experiencing. If you wish, you can provide a note and/or a picture of yourself. Sometimes, the children like to practice their writing skills and will write back to you.

So far, we have collected 17 boxes, and this year, we would love to collect a total of **60 or more**. This might seem like an aggressive goal, but we can do it together! We will take your donations through Sunday morning, November 23rd. On that afternoon, the boxes will be transported to a local relay center. Enjoy filling your boxes for those who can't wait to receive them! If you do not want to make a whole box yourself, you are welcome to donate items for the youth to fill shoeboxes with all of the donated items.



FCHUM School Supply Drive Thank You

With your donations and many from others too, Fern Creek Highview United Ministries was able to send **315 children** back to school well prepared, with backpacks full! The regular meeting of the congregational council was called to order at 11:40 a.m. by council president, Brenda Firquin. A quorum was established. Prayer was offered by Pr. Kerri McFarland.

Members present: Brenda Firquin, Cheryl Markley, Connie Miller, Andrea Goebel, Larry Faue, Buddy Zimmerman, Rita Sarson, Kenna Markley, youth rep., Paul Kiser, Pr. McFarland, Rod Firquin, recording secretary. Member absent: Bill Thompson

The minutes of the June 8, 2014 meeting were printed in the July newsletter, (no July meeting). M/S-L. Faue/B. Zimmerman to accept as printed. Carried.

Pastor's Report: Pr. McFarland

- 1. Pr. McFarland is in search of the framed founding member document. It was in the old narthex, current Swasko library. If you have knowledge of where this important church document is, please contact Pr. McFarland.
- 2. Pr. McFarland is in the process of completing the acknowledgements of gifts to the church in memory of Kay Bunner.
- 3. Jim Brotzge has made a donation in memory of his wife, Millie. Pr. McFarland suggested the gift be used to purchase Christmas (white) paraments for the sanctuary. Council agrees this would be a wonderful addition to our worship during Christmas, since we do not currently have paraments for this season. Pr. McFarland will contact Jim to confirm this gift.
- 4. The memorial gifts in memory of Merritt Blow were discussed. Pr. McFarland and council suggest these gifts be used to purchase Bibles for use in Sunday School and youth activities.
- 5. Robert Glenn Crabb was baptized on 8/10/14. Welcome to our newest baptized member.
- 6. Pastor McFarland will be on vacation October 3-11.
- 7. The adult Sunday school class will study Martin Luther's Small Catechism. All are invited to this study.
- 8. The annual stewardship focus will be November 2-23.

President's Report: Brenda Firquin

1. Attendance continues to be steady through the summer. Looking forward to increased attendance as Sunday school begins in September.

Financial Reports: See printed reports at the end of these minutes.

- 1. June and July Treasurer's Report: M/S-P. Kiser/A. Goebel to accept the reports as presented. Carried. It was noted there appears to be a shift from giving to the mortgage fund to the general operating fund over the last quarter. While general giving is holding its own, giving to the building fund has dropped. We currently have a 3 month buffer in the building fund. The council discussed this issue and possible ways to deal with this decrease.
- 2. Quarterly Financial Secretary's Report: M/S- L. Faue/B. Zimmerman to accept the report as presented.

Old Business:

1. It was reported by the VBS staff, that the props for our VBS were given to St. John's for use in their VBS. This is an example of true Lutheran brotherhood. Thanks to all who helped the VBS staff construct and arrange the amazing props. It is good to know they were used more than one time.

New Business:

1. As reported in emails to the congregation, the church office was burglarized on 8/3/14. No funds are missing due to quick action by Buddy Zimmerman in notifying our partner bank. Apparently, the office door was jimmied and the thief gained access to the office. Due to this and other frequent "visitors" found in the old narthex during service, the door to that area will remain locked at all times. This includes during services. Sunday School staff will need to work out a system to secure the door when that educational hour begins. Members are also reminded those doors should be locked at all times. It has been found unlocked as recently as last Friday evening after 10:00 pm. If you enter that door, please lock it behind you. We have had many "visitors" enter the building when they see a car or two in the lot. Most are looking for a cash donation for their personal cause, which other area churches have refrained from providing. It is for your safety and the protection of the church that this door is kept locked <u>at all times</u>.

St. Stephen Scroll

- Storm clean-up was paid for (\$495.00) from the rental house account. The large ash tree in front of the church has been infested with ash borers like many in the area. The professional suggested we watch it over the next few seasons. It may recover due to its age and general good health. If not, it will need to be removed. More information on this as it becomes necessary.
- 3. A special congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, September 21 following the 10:00 a.m. service. It will focus on the financial health of the congregation as we enter the final quarter of the year. This meeting was suggested at the congregational meeting earlier this spring. Updated financial information will be shared and plans for budgeting for 2015 will be on the agenda.

- 1. On September 20 from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. a night of fine "Big Band" music, dancing, and fellowship will be hosted by the worship and music committee. Our talented organist, Hank Evans, and his ensemble will play for us. It is hoped this will become an annual event and will offer an opportunity for all to let their hair down a little and enjoy some great music and fellowship. The cost to attend is \$5 per person.
- 2. Communion server instructions are now posted in the sacristy.
- 3. Andrea Tyson is now the prayer chain chairperson. Any directions or suggestions should be directed to Andrea. Thanks for taking this important task on.
- 4. 315 children were served through our donations to FCHUM's school supply donations. Thanks to all who supported this needed effort with your donations and your time.

- 2. Watch for a fall work day in late September. It is hoped we can complete the painting of the old part of the church as well as some general fall clean-up and preparation for the winter season.
- 3. The last storm which hit on a Sunday morning caused light damage to some exterior flashing on the sanctuary. It was easily repaired and no damage resulted.
- 4. A new storm door was installed at the rental house. The back door now has a very nice door. Thanks to Herb Warren and Rod Firquin for completing this chore.

Christian Education: A. Goebel

- 1. The education committee will meet on 8/12 to discuss the curriculum and calendar for the upcoming Sunday school year.
- The youth quake is planned for January 2015 in Cincinnati, OH. Our youth have been and will continue to be involved in raising funds to attend this event. All members are asked to generously support their efforts to raise adequate funds to pay for travel and registration.
- 3. It was reported the highest attendance during VBS was 46. A great turn out and wonderful support by all involved.

Social Ministry: Pr. McFarland/R. Firquin

- 1. Be aware the annual Thanksgiving food pantry drive at FCHUM is just around the corner. Begin bringing in any items that would be given to support the food pantry during the holiday season.
